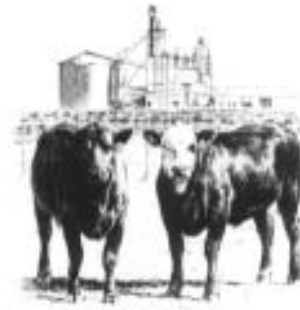

3. Beef

1. General



Title: **The Lively Calf**

Format: VHS

Content: A discussion on the management of cow/calf operations. It stresses the importance of proper nutrition, housing and breeding.

Length: 23 minutes

Title: **Growth Implants**

Format: VHS

Content: Examines the growth rate of beef animals with and without the use of implants. Discusses the use of synovex and Ral-gro, their method of action and the growth that results. Focuses on their proper implant. Produced for the USA National 4-H Meat Science Projects.

Length: 15 minutes

Title: **Herefords– The Basic Breed**

Format: VHS

Content: This promotional tape of Herefords begins with the history of the breed and the changes Herefords have gone through over the years. It is impossible for a breed to be everything to everybody, but this video show the viewer that Herefords have what counts where it counts. The video also discusses the Canadian Hereford Association and the service it provides.

Length: 15 minutes

Title: **Beef Retail Cuts Identification**

Format: VHS

Content: Includes: a live steer, skeleton and a beef side were used to show the wholesale cuts and major bones; 58 boneless and bone-in retail cuts are rotated while being identified and explained; accepted industry with hints relating to location, major muscles and bones, shape, exposed, faces, and size. Script writer and narrator is G.W. Davis (Meat Scientist, Texas Tech University). NOTE: Although it relates to the American Beef Grading, it is still in part applicable to the Canadian system. It may be too advanced for many young members.

Title: **Design Your 4-H Steer**

Format: VHS

Content: This video is based on the steer project in Ohio, USA. It focuses on the project and how to prepare for a show.

Length: 26 minutes

II. Selection and Preparation

Title: **Fitting a Steer for Show**

Format: VHS

Content: An introduction to the art of fitting a steer for the show ring. The proper techniques for blowing, brushing and clipping are shown, along with the tools used and materials that are used to make the job easier. The differences when fitting bulls and females are also touched upon. Although intended primarily for the inexperienced exhibitor, even veterans to the show can pick up a few tips.

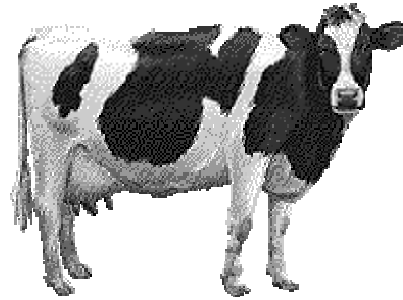

4. Dairy

I. General



Title: **The Milky Way**

Format: VHS

Content: The Milky Way is an exciting video which brings the story of milk to life from the dairy cow on the farm to the glass on the table. Through onsite footage and animation, the video entertains and educates as it explores in simple terms the various systems of the milk industry: production on the human body. This lively video demonstrates the use of modern technology, depicts the dairy industry's commitment to environmental farm practices, illustrates a number of career opportunities and shows the safe and efficient manner in which milk is processed.

Length: 15 minutes

Title: **Dairy Cow Management: An Introduction**

Format: VHS

Content: Explains some of terminology common to the dairy cattle industry. Provides a brief description of management and milking techniques. Produced by the University of Guelph.

Length: 18 minutes

Title: **Functional Conformation of Dairy Cattle**

Format: CD (Both English and French)

Content: Understand the dairy cow from the inside and out! Conformation evaluations: Animate and see. Explore the internal anatomy. See how classifying herds make more profit. Find out producers have to say.

Title: **Hoof Care in Dairy Cattle**

Format: VHS

Content: Dick Bristol, Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, and Jim Crowley, Extension Dairy Specialist, discuss factors that contribute to foot problems. Bristol demonstrates the procedure for examining a dairy cow's foot and Bob Holterman, a professional hoof trimmer, demonstrates how he trims a front and rear hoof. Divided into 3 parts which may be shown at once or separately. They are:

- 1) Causes and prevention of foot problems
- 2) Examine the foot
- 3) Hoof trimming

Length: 40 minutes.

Title: **Body Condition and Scoring**

Format: VHS

Content: This video shows how to assign numbers from 1-5 based on the body condition of the animal to determine the amount of fat.

Length: 25 minutes

Title: **Causes of Milk Fat Variations and Depressions**

Format: VHS

Content: Recording and comparing milk samples; electronic readings of fat content; influencing factors of variations; importance of keeping regular milking hours; factors that influence production; maintenance of milking equipment.

Length: 23 minutes

Title: **The Management of Calving**

Format: VHS

Content: The objective of this video is to show some facts involved with pregnancy and how to improve the chances of a calf's survival. It also examines the stages and problems associated with giving birth.

Length: 30 minutes

Title: **Mastitis Prevention and Control Part 1& 2**

Format: VHS

Content: Tape 1– Provide information on methods and practices to prevent and control mastitis, mastitis pathogens, host defense, monitoring mastitis.

Length: 44 minutes

Tape 2– recommended milking procedure; post milking teat dip protocols, milk quality, milking systems.

Length: 40 minutes

Title: **Producing Milk of Good Quality and Flavour**

Format: VHS

Content: Patterns and promotion of milk consumption. Importance of good tasting milk. Proper cooling temperatures of milk. Importance of cleanliness and good ventilation. Proper balance in feeding program. Quality control requirements. Maintain good herd health.

Length: 32 minutes

II. Selection and Preparation

Title: **Showmanship... Leading to Win!**

Format: VHS

Content: Showmanship is leading an animal in a way that displays it to its best advantage. This excellent video presents the fundamentals in showmanship as well as demonstrates showmanship tips when in the ring. A judge will tell you what he is looking for when he judges a showmanship class. Produced by Holstein Canada/ Holstein Ontario.

Length: 13 minutes

Title: **Clipping Dairy Cattle**

Format: VHS

Content: Anyone who has ever clipped a dairy animal for show knows that it is an art requiring refined techniques and sound knowledge of the equipment and tools used. This video tape take you from rough cut through the final clipping the day of the show. You will see the award winning techniques of an internationally recognized dairy clipping expert while carefully chosen narration emphasizes important points along the way. The techniques about clipping, handling the equipment and evaluating the animal presented in this video really can make the difference between a winner and runner-up.

Length: 21 minutes

Title: **Practice Dairy Judging (Heifers)**

Format: VHS

Content: A teaching video for 4-H'ers to practice their judging. Classes include Holstein Junior Yearlings, milking Shorthorn Senior Heifer Calves, Jersey Senior Yearlings, Brown Swiss Junior yearlings and Holstein Senior Heifer Calves. Clear views are shown of each heifer's rear, walking, posing and top. Produced by Educational Video Inc (1987).

Title: **Conformation in Horses**

Format: VHS

Content: Learn about your horse's body structure and then judge conformation according to the information received in this presentation. Having good conformation is a real plus for any show animal.

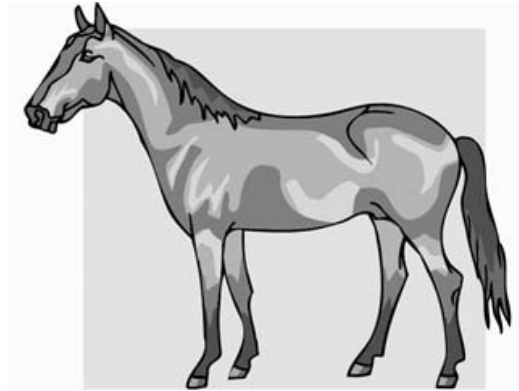
Length: 27 minutes

Format: VHS

Content: This presentation will make the viewers more aware of the importance of extra care and attention during the various stages of gestation and foaling.

Title: **Horse Sense**

Format: VHS

Content: Judge, trainer and USA college professor, Jim Heird discusses the safety, grooming and halter breaking for the novice horse enthusiast. Basic clipping, bedding and trailering are covered.

Title: **4-H Horsemanship**

Format: DVD

Content: Production of the Alberta Horse and Pony.

Title: **Internal Parasites of Horses**

Format: DVD

Content: Learn about the harmful effects of internal parasites and how to treat the horse for parasite infection. Take preventative measures.

Title: Hoof Care and Basic Shoeing

Format: VHS

Content: This video is a demonstration of what you can do and when to call your farrier. It features the world famous Bud Beaston of Oklahoma Farriers' College.

Title: **Basic Principles of Hoof Care and Cold Horse Shoeing**

Format: VHS

Content: This presentation starts off identifying tools for hoof care and shoeing and the function of each tool. You'll get a demonstration on handling procedures for picking up and cleaning the feet of the foal or horse and the steps involved in cleaning, removing shoes, trimming and shoeing.

Title: **The Mare and Foal**

Format: VHS

Content: Veterinarian David Ramey covers the breeding of the mare to birth of the foal. Also detailed are infertility, postnatal care, natural and artificial breeding, etc.

Length: 60 minutes

II. Tack and Equipment

Title: **Choosing, Assembling and Using Bridles**

Format: VHS

Content: This presentation covers bridle selection, assembly and proper use of the bridle and its various parts. Your horse will respond to your commands when the bridle fits and works properly.

Length: 24 minutes

Title: **Haltering and Tying**

Format: VHS

Content: Learn about the different types of halters, their proper uses and handling techniques. The viewers will receive information on tie ropes and tying techniques.

Length: 25 minutes

Title: **Saddle Selection**

Format: VHS

Content: A saddle represents a major purchase and selection and purchase requires careful deliberation and knowledge. This presentation provides a description of the various types of saddles and the injuries that a horse may incur due to an improperly fitted saddle. Other information is given regarding an appropriate selection.

Length: 18 minutes

Title: **Miscellaneous– Tack and Equipment**

Format: VHS

Content: Examination of the various pieces of tack and equipment used.

Length: 25 minutes

III. Judging and Showing

Title: **Showmanship at Halter by Richard Shrake**

Format: VHS

Content: You see others win, but you don't know why. This tape will let you in on the secrets that gives you that winning edge. It covers four major topics: 1) training of a horse 2) grooming and clipping 3) ring procedures and routines and 4) exercises and drills to benefit the member.

Title: **Horse Training: Early Riding**

Format: VHS

Content: A pleasure and safety oriented approach to preparing the horse for the ride outside the paddock. Begins with longeing and progresses through backing to tacking up, mounting and the ride. Looks at common commands; presents common faults and how to correct them. Produced by the University of Guelph.

Length: 36 minutes

Title: **Horse Training: Ground Driving and Lunging**

Format: VHS

Content: The instructor demonstrates how to lunge, tack up for driving and ground drive, using three horses at different stages of training: well trained spoiled and green.

Title: **Genetics of Coat Color of Horses**

Format: VHS

Content: This presentation gives a general overview of genetics and the role it plays in determining the color of the horse's coat.

Length: 13 minutes

Title: **Horse Safety On The Ground**

Format: VHS

Content: This video is a documentary slide/tape presentation showing the basics of catching, lading, tying and grooming of your horse.

Length: 18 minutes

Title: **Draft Horses Come in Handy**

Format: VHS

Content: This video contains valuable ideas and instruction from start to finish on training draft horses. It demonstrates an in-depth look at the equipment, handling and training techniques of this big horse.

Title: **Alberta Horse Breeds for the World**

Format: VHS

Content: This video gives the viewer a glimpse at many horse breeds including Pinto, Standard Bred, Morgan, Arabian, Draught, Percheron, Tennessee Walker, Paint, Saddlebred, Sport Horse, Norwegian Fjord, Appaloosa, Quarter Horse and the Welsh Pony. A brief description of characteristics and origins is given for each of the above mentioned breeds. This tape is only "fair" in picture quality.

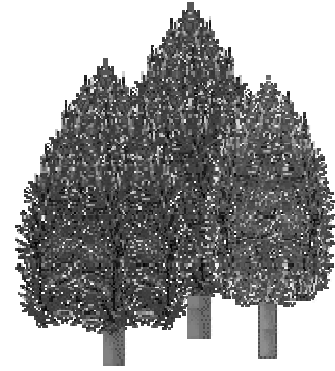
