DATES: September 1, 2008 - August 31, 2009

WHAT: Club Community Project Competition

WHO: Open to all P.E.I. 4-H Clubs

PRIZES: Keeper Plaque plus... 1st - \$100
2nd - \$75
3rd - \$50
4th - \$25

OBJECTIVE: To instill in 4-H members the importance of community work and involvement.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. This competition is open to 4-H clubs of Prince Edward Island. The competitor is the whole club; however, individual project groups may do separate community projects which will be considered a part of the total club effort.
2. The community project(s) can be local, provincial, national or international in scope.
3. The community project(s) CANNOT be fundraising activities.
4. The community project(s) CANNOT be a regular 4-H club event, i.e. communication event or achievement day. (The spring roadside clean-up is acceptable.)
5. The community project(s) should benefit/involve more than the 4-H'ers and their families.

HOW:

By **November 13, 2009** the participating 4-H club must submit to the Provincial 4-H Office, P.O. Box 2000, 40 Enman Cres., Royalty Centre - Room 238, Charlottetown, C1A 7N8, a report of their club community project(s). This report should be in a three-ring, binder, photo album or scrapbook. It can be typed or neatly handwritten and must be in the following three part format.

PART I: Introductory Page

In this page, include:

- A) Name of club and district
- B) General history/background of club
- C) List of members and their projects
- D) List of leaders and their projects

NOTE: Club community projects will fit into one of two categories: minor or major project. Clubs can report on one to five of their major projects but five is the maximum. The remainder of the club's community projects should be listed under minor projects.

Community projects classified as minor would include such things as roll call collections of newspapers for the animals shelter, food for the food bank or cleaning supplies for the community center, any monetary donations to charitable organizations such as Easter Seals, Christmas Daddies, etc. Community projects classified as major would include projects such as Canada Day celebrations for the community, a Halloween or Christmas party for pre-4-H children in the community, the annual roadside clean-up, Easter baskets for the seniors in the community, etc. Major projects would be those that provided more benefits to the club's own community.

PART II: Major Community Projects

There must be a write-up for each major project. The write-up must include:

- A) A description of the community projects
- B) Dates and places of the project
- C) Number of members that participated in project (do not list names)
- D) Benefits to the community from the project
- E) Benefits to the club
- F) Pictures of the event (if any)
- G) Any publicity or press coverage (press clippings) of the event (if applicable)

PART III: Minor Community Projects

- A) A list (in point form) of all minor projects completed by the club

NOTE: To supplement this part, pictures, newspaper clippings or thank you cards may be included in the pages following the list of minor projects.
